Day of Prayer 2013

At the start of a year when new ventures and meetings are being planned in our churches and in the circuit, it is felt that some time ought to be put aside for prayer. Prayer is an expression of our life-long dependence on God. The circuit is asking each of its churches to pause for a mid-week prayer meeting during this coming week. At Castle Street we are going to meet this Wednesday (20th February) from 10.00 until 10.30am (before the coffee morning) in the Aldersgate Room.

Printed information is now available to assist people in this time, and this includes a full list of times and venues elsewhere in the circuit for any who are unable to come on Wednesday morning, as well as prayer topics for each session. Sign up for prayer texts during Lent

Young Methodists are offering people the chance to sign up for prayer text messages over the Lent period. The prayer texts have been written by children and young people from across the Methodist Church. They are intended to inspire other young people embarking on the 46-day spiritual journey of Lent. Mobile phone users can sign up to receive daily prayers by texting LENT to 66777 (charged at the standard network rate). The texts will be free to receive, and will be sent at 12.30pm every day during Lent (including Sundays) – they are aimed at children and young people. Church at Castle weekend away – 21st to 23rd June at High Leigh

Details and booking forms for Church at Castle's weekend away were circulated a few months ago, but now it's time for those going to fill in a booking form and pay a deposit. This doesn't mean that additional people won't be able to book nearer the time, but a deposit has already been sent to the conference centre to reserve bedrooms, and we need to have a better idea of who is going in order to plan the weekend in more detail.

This weekend of fellowship, fun, prayer, study and worship is being held at the High Leigh Christian Conference Centre in Hoddesdon, Hertfordshire (about three-quarters of an hour's drive down the A10 from Cambridge), where accommodation is in either fairly recently-built or recently refurbished rooms with en suite facilities – and the food is also excellent (ask Brian if you want to know more!). The programme begins on the Friday evening (dinner is at 7pm) and ends at tea time on Sunday. The cost is £136 per person (£68 for children aged 6-13 inclusive, with under 6s going free), which includes accommodation for two nights and all meals, plus refreshments mid-morning and late afternoon.

Our new website

Castle Street's revamped website (www.castlestreet.org.uk) has been up and running now for a number of weeks, although it is likely there may be a few tweaks in the coming weeks or months.

One of the features is a News section (advertising forthcoming events), and the most recent to be added can be accessed from the Homepage (for those who are not web-literate, what you see when you first reach the website). They can also be reached via the "News and Events" menu at the top of the page, by clicking on "Latest news".

This "Latest news" feature is already being used to allow documents to be downloaded, such as the preparation materials for the Lent Study Course on Tuesdays, or the information about this week's prayer meetings across the circuit. There are also links to relevant news stories on other websites.
