That is not taking place, but is superseded by the bring-and-share lunch to follow our harvest festival morning service on Sunday 22nd September – two week's time – which Alison is leading. ## **Cambs Historic Churches Trust (CHCT) – Ride and Stride next Saturday**

Saturday 14th September is the annual day for going round the churches of our land. John Boocock is planning to cycle round the North Stowe Deanery area to visit some forty churches over a forty-mile route (see below). He is seeking sponsors! Money donated goes half to CHCT and half to a church of choice: this year to Barton Baptist Church which has needed serious underpinning and refurbishment recently.

The above target is considerably less ambitious than the 2011 effort which netted sixty churches over seventy-five miles and yielded £466 with half then nominated for Castle Street car park improvements – a project now happily achieved. This year's proposed route is from Castle Street via Chesterton to Milton and Waterbeach, then Cottenham, Willingham to Swavesey and Over and back via Elsworth, Bar Hill, Longstanton, Oakington, Histon and Girton.

On the same day it would be good if we “manned” a welcome table at Castle Street, between 10am and 6pm, to greet and encourage folk who will include Church at Castle in their itinerary. See the notice board to sign up for hosting a time slot.

## **"A Faith to Live By" service at Haslingfield Methodist Church**

Haslingfield Methodist Church's regular series exploring what Christianity means in practice resumes this evening (Sunday 8th September) after the summer break. Starting at 6.30pm, each one usually includes a time of worship, a presentation and a time for discussion, and is followed by refreshments. In the first one, Liz Davies (a member of Oakington Methodist Church) will address the topic "Language – bridge or barrier?".

When Liz was sixteen she was invited to stay with the family of an Italian student, and this began a relationship with Italy and two Italian families lasting fifty-one years. As a result of this encounter Liz trained and moved into Public Service Interpreting. Following this she helped to set up the first "not-for-profit" interpreting / translation agency for public services (legal / medical and local government) and has worked with Italian patients coming to Addenbrooke's Hospital for liver transplants for nearly twenty years. Liz's time in Italy taught her that Methodists have something to learn from Catholic Mass, and the agency has provided a special insight into communities of colleagues of many races and faiths.
