New pattern for evening services

Cambridge Churches Homelessness Project – latest update

This has now started, and Castle Street is host on Wednesday evenings (until the end of March). We are very grateful to the small band of volunteers who have offered their services, but it is falling to the same small group of people every time, so if you can help out in any way, those people would, I am sure, welcome you with open arms!

Help is needed in the following ways:

- Cooking and serving food on Wednesday evenings, and talking to the guests who are staying overnight.
- Staying overnight there will be shifts, so that some people are able to sleep for part of the night.
- Washing (and drying) the cotton sleeping bag liners this is an ideal task for someone who is unable to get involved in any of the churchbased parts of the project. You just need to pick them up from the church sometime after Thursday morning and return them in time for the following Wednesday evening.
- Someone to be at the church early on Wednesday morning (probably around or shortly after 8am) to receive the kit from the preceding church. So far only one person has offered to do this, and that person is also helping out on Wednesday nights.

The more people who volunteer to help, the fewer times everyone will be needed on the rota. If you are able to offer help at all, please contact Revd. Alison Walker as soon as possible – Castle Street is on duty for the first time this coming Wednesday! Thank you.

"A Faith to Live By" at Haslingfield Methodist Church

The next in this monthly series of special services takes place next Sunday evening (11th January) at 6.30pm. Entitled "Let us make a joyful noise", it will be led by Robin Walker (Alison's husband).

Why is it that music plays so large a role in our Christian worship, and such a powerful force in our religious identity? Robin will share something of the importance music has in his worshipping life, as a performer and church musician. Robin works as an organist and conductor, both in church music and on the concert platform. He studied at the Royal Academy of Music, and has held church posts at Hinde Street Methodist Church in London, HM Chapel Royal in the Tower of London, and is currently Assistant Organist of St. George's, Hanover Square in London. He conducts the Cantate chamber choir in Kent and is in demand as an organ soloist and accompanist, both here in the UK and abroad.
