For a few years, folk at Castle Street have been supporting the Cambridge Foodbank by donating items of non-perishable food. Thank you to everyone who has helped with this. Unfortunately, the amount we collect has gradually been dropping, so this is a reminder about this important work and a request for more people to get involved if they feel able.

Items required urgently (and on a regular basis) are:

tinned meats for eating hot (eg mince, chicken in sauce, etc)

fruit juice (2 litre long-life)

instant coffee (small jars)

granulated sugar (500g preferred)

cooking oil (500g preferred)

small salt                      small pepper

pot noodles                      shower gel

deodorant (ladies and gents)

toothbrushes and toothpaste

In addition, the following extras would be appreciated for Christmas:

tinned ham

pickles

chocolate logs

Christmassy biscuits

snacks (nuts, Pringles, dried fruit, etc.)

children's selection boxes

cheesy biscuits (or similar)

sweets for children or adults

strong Christmassy supermarket bags
