This is aimed at children aged 3-10, who will explore the Easter story through "Godly play". It starts at 10.30am (registration from 10.15am), and lasts about an hour. Castle Street Easter Breakfast

There's a sign-up sheet on the noticeboard for anyone who plans to come to the Easter Breakfast at 9am next Sunday (see *Castle View*), so we can get a rough idea of numbers – or let Chris Rayson know. There is no fixed charge, but there will be a plate for donations. We hope you will come along – and it is timed to follow the short open-air service on the Mound (with tea and coffee served from 8.30am).



Easter Egg Hunt at St. Giles' Church, Easter Monday from 2pm to 4pm

There will be activities for all the family, and every child will receive an Easter activities book. The programme of events will include: craft activities – decorating cupcakes and making Easter bonnets; an Easter egg hunt in the garden; and a parade of Easter bonnets (with prizes). Refreshments will be available (for which there will be a modest charge). All are welcome, and admission is free.



Korean Presbyterian Church – important notice

Last Sunday we welcomed the Korean Presbyterian Church, who are now using our premises for worship and fellowship every Sunday afternoon. They begin to arrive from about 1pm (we need to vacate the building by about 1.30pm) and leave by about 6pm (in time for our evening service). During that time they have use of the entire building, and this includes using the kitchen to prepare and serve a meal.

They also have use of the car park – and there may be cars parked down the centre. Any Castle Street cars left in the car park after about 1.30pm are at risk of being blocked in, although we still have priority. It is therefore suggested that any cars being left over lunch are parked as close to the gate end as possible; there are also a number of "Please do not block in" notices available for you to display in your windscreen.

As is our usual custom on the Sunday immediately after Easter, on Sunday 23rd April we shall join with the other Church at Castle congregations for a United Service. The service is at St. Augustine's, Richmond Road; it begins at 9.30am, and will include Holy Communion.
