Action for Children collection boxes

It is Action for Children (AfC) Sunday next week (9th July). This is the time when we round up the Black Lantern Boxes from our lovely collectors and pool the donations to make a single monetary gift to AfC.

In 2016 AfC worked with 390,000 babies, children and families throughout the UK. The impact of this work by AfC has been measured as:

- 71% of children we work with improved their mental health;
- 77% of children and young people are more able to achieve their educational potential;
- 72% of children under 5 we work with are now reaching their developmental milestones;
- 73% of children at risk of neglect have warmer more supportive relationships with their parent or carer(s);
- 74% of children at risk of neglect who we work with experience an improvement in family life due to improved routines.
