We shall also welcome back, as a supernumerary minister, Revd. Stephen Burgess – a previous circuit superintendent and also minister at Castle Street, who has recently “sat down” as Chair of the York and Hull District. Stephen will be the preacher.

There will be a circuit choir for the service, led by Geoff Batty and Brian Carter, and all singers will be most welcome to come along for a rehearsal before the service, at 5.30pm.



Harvest Weekend

Next Sunday morning is our harvest festival, and this year we have an Indian theme – under the guidance of Joy and Geoff Levine.

On Saturday (9th September) at 7pm, we will look at the issues of agriculture and drought in India with an illustrated talk. The talk will be followed by an Indian meal and, hopefully, much discussion while we eat. We've had an offer for the meal to be specially cooked for us (and there should be some mild dishes available), and it would be helpful if those planning to come would sign up on the sheet on the notice board.

The all-age morning service on Sunday, led by Joy, will depict farming and harvest celebrations in Tamil Nadu – both Christian and Hindu.

Bible Month 2017 – thirty days with James

Times and venues for this four-week Bible study (more details of which can be found in the September *Castle View*) are now confirmed – they will take place on late Thursday afternoons in Barton, starting at 4pm (at either John and Sheila’s or Ruth and Martin’s house), with parallel sessions on Friday evenings at Castle Street, starting at 7.30pm.

The first sessions are this week (Thursday 7th and Friday 8th September), and the topic is chapter 1 of the Letter of James – “Doers of the Word”. It then misses a week, so the remaining three sessions will be on 21st and 22nd September (James 2: “Faith and Works”), 28th and 29th September (James 3: “Speech and Wisdom”), and 5th and 6th October (James 4: “Living for the Lord”). There’s still space for people to join either group. Don’t worry if you miss a week – just read the relevant chapter of James.
