“A Faith to Live By” – tonight at Haslingfield Methodist Church

The next in this series of services will be with Revd Hankyu Kim (a research student at Wesley House, and our preacher at Castle Street this morning – not Pastor Kim of the Keolim Church: sorry for the confusion!), who will talk about the meeting of Korean Spirituality and Christianity, Bible, prayer, nationalism and evangelism. Revd Hankyu Kim worked in the Korean Methodist Church for around ten years as a minister following his ordination in 2006, and is now studying the Methodist mission in Northern Ghana.

While Asia is mostly stony ground for Christianity, Korean Christianity is particularly striking. In the 1990s for example, twenty-three Korean churches were among the fifty biggest churches in the world. The characteristics of Korean Christianity are also very distinctive such as a strong tradition of early morning prayer meetings and of energetic evangelism. In his talk, Revd Hankyu Kim will briefly present the history of Korean Christianity and its essential characteristics from a viewpoint of how Christianity has been contextualised in Korean culture since the end of nineteenth century.

As usual, there will be a short time of worship, a presentation, refreshments and discussion. It starts at 6pm. If anyone would like transport to and from Haslingfield for this event, please speak to a steward.
