Castle Street World Church Weekend – next Saturday and Sunday

We're celebrating the World Church next weekend, with an African and Fairtrade theme. It is also an opportunity to raise funds for our circuit project, which will contribute towards the building of a new Methodist youth centre in Kenya.

On Saturday evening, starting at 5.30pm, we shall play "The Chocolate Game" – a game for all the family, which traces the journey of the cocoa bean from tree to chocolate bar, discovering the difficulties faced by workers in the chocolate trade. There will also be the chance to enjoy Fairtrade chocolate cakes and other nibbles. Then Bishop Alice Muthoni Mwillla of the Kenyan Methodist Church will lead All-Age Worship on Sunday morning, which we hope will be quite African in style.

### **Parish Prayer Walk – this afternoon, starting at St Luke's Church at 2.30pm**

This walk is a Church at Castle response to the "Thy Kingdom Come" Ascension to Pentecost ten-day global wave of prayer. Everyone is welcome to join in (the whole route is flat and can be followed by electric buggies) and cover as much or as little of the route as they are able.

From St Luke's, the route will follow the parish boundaries and pass by the river to Magdalene Bridge, St Giles' Church (with the Romanian Orthodox congregation joining in prayer), Castle Street Methodist, and on to Castle Mound. Those wanting a short walk of one mile can return to St Luke's. Others can continue up to the Ascension Burial Ground and on to Eddington. From there we go (via toilet facilities at the pub) along the parish boundary from Hotel Felix to Histon Road, then to St Augustine's for refreshment, and finally back to St Luke's. The whole walk with stops for prayer will take best part of three hours.

A united bring-and-share picnic in St Giles' Church Garden, with fun activities for all ages. This will be an informal gathering of unity, with all churches in the neighbourhood invited to come along and join in the celebration of Pentecost. ### **“Science meets Faith” at Wesley Methodist Church, Monday 10th June**

In the last of these lectures for the current academic year, Prof David Baguley of the Hearing Sciences Research Group at the University of Nottingham will talk about “Hearing and Listening”. He will take a tour of the human hearing system, exploring the consequences of hearing too little (hearing loss), hearing too much (hyperacusis), and tinnitus. David will discuss the difference between hearing and listening, and what this may mean in practice in terms of faith.

David is an ordained Anglican minister, and is a self-supporting Associate Minister at St Martin's Church, Sherwood, Nottingham. His research themes include tinnitus and hearing loss associated with chemotherapy treatment for cancer. For more than thirty years he worked at Addenbrooke's Hospital, latterly as Head of Audiology and Hearing Implants.

The lecture will start at 7.45pm, with refreshments from 7.15pm.
