

### Addenbrooke's Hospital Chaplaincy – fundraising activity

The Chaplaincy Department at Addenbrooke's Hospital is currently funding, via the Addenbrooke's Charitable Trust, a full-time Pastoral Care for Cancer post. To raise further funds, a team from the chaplaincy — "Seas the Day" — is entering a boat in the 15th annual Dragon Boat Festival on the River Cam on Saturday 7th September, and has created the One Hundred Envelope Challenge.

One hundred envelopes in the Chaplaincy office have been labelled with the amounts £1 to £100, and individuals or groups are sought to sponsor each envelope – if each envelope is filled, it will raise £5,050!
